1 BROWNING EXPANDS KNIFE ROSTER WITH OBSESSION SERIES Browning continues to add to its sporting knife roster with the Obsession Series. These folding lock-back knives feature Sandvik 12C27 stainless steel blades. The main blade has a drop-point design, and the two-blade model comes with an accompanying gut hook that's handy for dressing wild game. Handles are made of stainless steel with either G-10 or wood inserts. A nylon sheath is included.

2 NIGHTLIGHTER CAP FEATURES BEAM IN THE BILL There's a new wrinkle in the lighted cap market called the Nightlighter, which features a bill with three built-in LED lights. The cap is made of cotton twill. Replaceable batteries are housed in the cap's lining and last up to 25 hours. An on/off switch is hidden under the bill. All electronics are waterproof.



3 WENGER RANGERGRIP HAS ERGONOMIC FEEL Multi-tools are handy complements to any duck hunter's blind bag, especially if they are comfortable. Wenger has got that covered with its RangerGrip 179 Patagonia Expedition Race Swiss Army Knife. Built for a survival competition in the rugged wilds of Patagonia, this multi-tool features 11 implements capable of performing at least 15 functions. The yellow body makes it easy to find on the ground or in your blind bag.
